

Interior Nations Relaunch Search for Three Local Women with 118 km Walk

Public assistance requested for any information on whereabouts

INTERIOR B.C. - First Nations will be leading a 118 km walk on May 21-22 in the Interior of British Columbia to search for three missing women and are requesting the public's help for any information around their possible whereabouts.

The walkers are looking for Caitlin Potts, Deanna Wertz and Ashley Simpson.

Deanna Wertz and Ashley Simpson were living in and last seen alive on Yankee Flats Rd. Caitlin Potts was last seen at Orchard Park Mall in Kelowna B.C.

The walk will take place in three sections over the territory from the Splatsin First Nation (near Enderby) to Sylix Territory (near Kelowna).

Pilot cars and walkers will be located at:

1. Yankee flats Road (South of Salmon Arm)
2. 30th Street (Vernon)
3. Pelmewash Parkway to Orchard Park Mall (Lake Country)

Anyone with information on the disappearance of these women can contact the Major Crimes division of the Southeast major crimes unit in Kelowna BC by dialing 9-1-1.

Organizers are also welcoming volunteers for wakening, pilot cars, water and gas card donation and those with drones who can volunteer their time. The Family of Caitlin Potts and Ashley Simpson will be in attendance.
